**Continuances.**

(a) Cases filed on or after March 1, 2014, may be continued by agreement. Announcement of this type may be submitted to the Court by letter or facsimile (not both), with a copy to opposing counsel or unrepresented parties. Announcements must be received by the Court no later than MONDAY, AUGUST 31, 2015.

(b) Cases filed before March 1, 2014, may be continued only by a motion granted by the Court. A Motion for Continuance may be made to the Court no later than FRIDAY, AUGUST 28, 2015, by filing the motion with the Clerk of Superior Court and providing the Court with a courtesy copy and proposed order. *No faxed or e-mailed motions will be accepted.*

(c) All calendar announcements are to be made directly to the Court's office pursuant to the above instructions.

**Effect of Failure to Answer Calendar.**

The failure to appear at a calendar sounding or otherwise to advise the Court as to whether a case is ready for trial may result in the dismissal without prejudice of plaintiff's action or defendant's answer, counterclaim, or cross claim. *See* U.S.C.R. 20(A).

**Pretrial Conferences.**

All cases announced "READY" for trial must have a pretrial conference before trial. The time of the pretrial conference assigned to your case will be provided by the Court following calendar call. Parties scheduled to attend a pretrial conference must bring a joint proposed pretrial order. *See* U.S.C.R. 7.2, 44.8.

**Settlements and Dismissals.**

Immediately upon the settlement or dismissal of a civil action, counsel or an unrepresented party shall notify the Court of such an event. U.S.C.R. 4.10.

**Copy of Motions to Assigned Judge.**

The Court is unaware of motions filed by the parties unless the filing party submits a courtesy copy to the judge that is assigned to that civil action. Counsel and unrepresented parties are responsible for ensuring that the Court receives a copy of all motions and briefs for which that judge is assigned. Otherwise, motions will not be considered filed and will not be grounds for delay of a trial.
